

Free Time

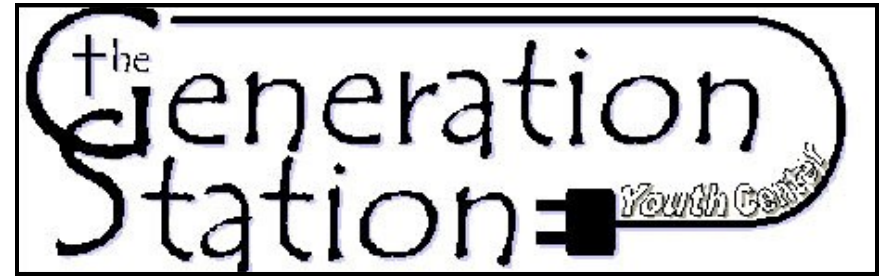

The Generation Station Out of School Program

The Generation Station Out of School Program provides safe out of school alternatives for youth during the hours when they are more apt to be home alone and in need of homework help. We support school, community and religious values, with activities including instructional and homework time, and organized recreation.

The Generation Station Out of School Program does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, national origin, disability, religion or sexual orientation. We are a faith-based non-profit community initiative of the Chesapeake City Ecumenical Association.

The Generation Station Out of School Program receives funding from the United Way of Cecil County, the Cecil County Government, local churches, service organizations and individuals.



Homework Time

One of the primary goals of the Generation Station Out of School Program is to help young people to be successful students. To fulfill this goal we offer homework time each program day. Our staff is available for assistance and will help with assignments, including projects. However, our program can only be helpful to students who come prepared daily with the necessary books and assignments. Please help us by encouraging your student to take advantage of homework time. Any student not having homework is asked to bring something to read or may be given an assignment by our staff to complete. During homework time, students are expected to be quiet and respectful of other youth so that they may complete their assignments.

Snack Time

A nutritious snack and drink are served daily. A menu is available monthly. This is a great way for families to help out by providing snack and drink donations.

Instruction, Special Programs and Activities

Instruction and activities are provided daily in a variety of areas which enhance academic experience and promote physical and emotional health. Team building, character education, drug, alcohol, and tobacco awareness, and abstinence training are regularly incorporated into the program day during instruction time. Enrichment activities including art, reading, writing and positive habit formation are also included.
